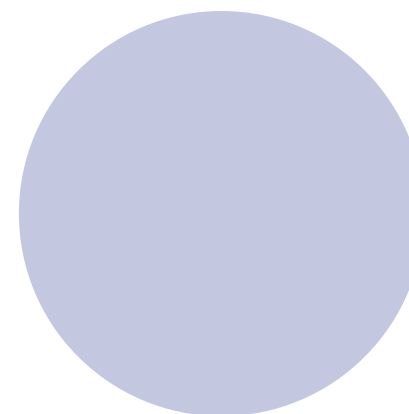
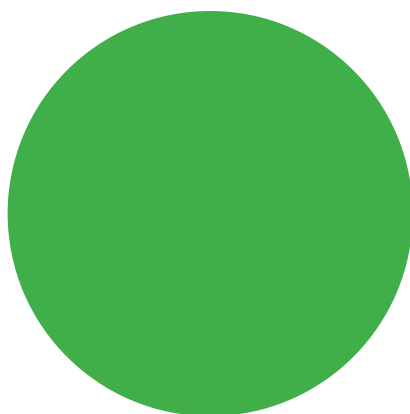
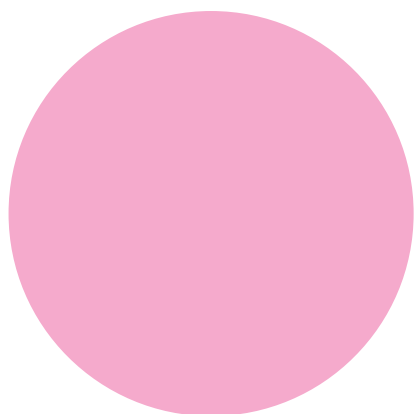


Courses in Italian Language & Culture
